# Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC)

#### Student Orientation Guide

The following is a set of steps you'll follow as an escort. Remember that you are a representative of our program and as such you should dress appropriately, business casual attire is recommended. In order to participate, students must meet all of the <u>requirements</u>, found in the <u>appendix</u> of this document.

- 1. As an escort, you'll receive an email from the Assistant Director with a list of students, and their emails.
- 2. You will reach out to the students via email introducing yourself and letting them know that you'll be escorting them to a meeting. Choose 2-3 meetings that work for you prior to responding. Include these meeting options in your response to the students.

- 3. During the pre-meeting orientation, consider the following agenda items:
  - a. What is AA?
    - i. Ask the students what they know about AA already? This will help you in providing them information about what AA is from your experience. They will likely know of AA from TV and Movies.
    - ii. Brief history of AA, introducing them to the formation of AA in 1935 in Akron, our founders.
    - iii. Big Book our primary text.
    - iv. The Program of AA the Steps, and the Traditions. The students should have access to PDF versions of the Steps, and the Traditions.
    - v. Religion vs. Spirituality. Touch on the spiritual nature of the program and that while they may hear references to God, prayer, etc. it is not a religious program and not affiliated with any sect, denomination.
  - b. What to expect at the meeting?
    - i. Give them an overview of what they'll experience.
    - ii. They should remain as an observer. Should not participate in the meeting, the 7th tradition, or sharing.
    - iii. If they are asked, they are to let folks know that they are a student observer but we do not offer this up unless we have to. Remember you should be escorting students to an open meeting observers are permitted at open meetings.
    - iv. Let them know that there will be a prayer during, or at the end of the meeting and that they should feel comfortable joining... or abstaining whatever they preference may be.

#### c. After the meeting

i. Arrange to gather again after the meeting to debrief and answer any additional questions. Offer your contact information so that they may reach out to you with any questions they may have while writing their assignment.

#### 4. After the meeting.

a. Send a thank you email, cc'ing <a href="mailto:cpcdirector@aasepia.org">cpcdirector@aasepia.org</a>, <a href="mailto:cpcdirector@aasepia.org">cpcdirector@aasepia.org</a>, and Lorie (for drexel students) - this is very important so that we can update the status on each student.

For example: Hello <Student>

Thanks for allowing me to escort you to the Never Alone Again Group this morning at 8:30am. I hope that it was a positive experience for you. I enjoyed our discussions before and after attending the meeting. Feel free to contact me if you have any further questions. Best of luck in your studies and all your future endeavors. Peace.
